

Using Publication Finder (an example)

In this instance we are using Publication Finder (from the Online Databases page of the EPCC Librarians) and we are looking for text from the 2001 Emory Law Journal. You can see below that we have full text of it for various years.

Our year (2001) can only be found in Nexis Uni database. This is an extremely large database so it is good to be specific. I clicked on “publication”, input three words from the article title AND the publication title. See below.
